
Animal Welfare Institute Of New Zealand

The Animal Welfare Institute of New Zealand (A.W.I.N.Z) is a charitable trust established to promote the welfare of animals.

Promotion of animal welfare through A.W.I.N.Z. includes the protection, control and conservation of animals along with the prevention of ill treatment and the relief of suffering of animals.

A.W.I.N.Z. supports in principle the work undertaken by the R.N.Z.S.P.C.A. and societies. However other humane differs from AWINZ such organisations in that it is a charitable trust rather than an incorporated society. Being a charitable trust means that the organisation is able to be more effective in obtaining results because of a simpler. modern and direct structure

A.W.I.N.Z. promotes the view that animals and people can live in harmony with each other and their environments.



What is the foundation philosophy which supports A.W.I.N.Z.?

The philosophy underpinning the work of A.W.I.N.Z. is one of respect for all animals coupled with the belief that an animal has as much right to live in harmony with the environment as people do.

It is the responsibility of people as controllers and manipulators of the environment to ensure that the requirements of animals are not forgotten. Through accommodating these requirements the problems of neglect and ill treatment of animals are addressed.
